PSO Committee Governance Structure Development

Operationalize Structures for Governance and Accountability, Assign roles and responsibility

March 2026

Community PR

Develop Communication and PR plan to ensure that community knows who we all are, and our goal to work with and for the community. Also to find creative ways to elevate their voice

May to July

Review Findings and Prioritize

Based on Community Assessments, develop a findings report and prioritize Committee focus. Identify any gaps in data to build community profile

July to September

Engage residents voice & strategies

Get community feedback on strategies and action steps on addressing prioritized community needs based on community assessment

September to November

Evaluation and Strategic Check Point

Developing an action plan draft that we can present to the community at the Harvest Festival to get their feedback and celebrate another year of working together

November

Community Event

Host Annual Harvest Festival bringing PSO residents and partners together to have fun

Building our Needs Assessment

Identify Key Resources: supporting child development and upward mobility

Reveal Gaps or Threats: hindering healthy child development and opportunity

Surface Opportunities: to strengthen and change conditions for children and families



Building our Needs Assessment

Building Community Data Profile

What existing Reports and Data do we have on our footprint?

- GOC Data Board
- Resident Feedback
- What else?

Data Collection & Community Engagement

What are the Focus groups we need to host to ensure that we are finding the voices that go unheard
Are there groups that have already started this process that we should include

Review & Summarize Assessment Findings

Look for reoccurring issues, challenges, or gaps highlighted by community members
Stay flexible to new information that may emerge and create touchpoints to regularly review

Develop Strategies and Action Steps

Brainstorming with diverse stakeholders, match strategy to objective and identify specific activities and interventions

Conduct Community Asset Mapping

How do we pinpoint the resources already in place (highlighting barriers or threats)
Are there areas we need to create equitable distribution of services
Are there partnerships that could strengthen the assets

Develop Findings & Reporting

Synthesize our Strengths, Gaps, and Opportunities
Make our findings Accessible to the community and organizations not in the room

Prioritize Issues & Establish Goals & Indicators

Determine need based on severity, scope, and how it impacts other factors to family success
How will we measure success to know if we are having positive outcome for our community

Set Timeline, Milestones, & Evaluation

Resident Feedback Analysis & Mapping

Instructions:

- Look at what the residents noted they needed for every child to grow and thrive
- What key resources already exist in the city to provide these supports?
- What are hypothesis of Gaps or Threats hindering families from successfully connecting?
- What are some opportunities to change the outcomes for families
- Are those supports within the PSO footprint?
- If the supports are already in the PSO footprint, are they over capacity or not?



Action Commitment:

Complete the organizational survey

Objective:

- to create a network that can support each org's "gaps".
- Identify how we can "lift" each other up and prime for opportunities to support the PSO footprint and families as a collaborative.
